### On the road to 99%



On the road to 99%: Broadband coverage as of Nov. 2024\*

131,000 Colorado households lack access to quality high-speed internet (previously reported 160,000 households)

Goal: Households Connected 94.8%	Current Status: 95.4%
Goal: Rural Households Connected 70%	Current Status: 75.2%


### How are we Getting there




#### Funding Sources:

- State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds HB21-1289
  - Allocated \$75M for digital inclusion, deployment and middle mile projects
  - Connected 12,529 locations
- Capital Projects Fund
  - Allocated \$113.5M for last mile fiber to the home in rural Colorado
  - Connected 18,000 locations
- Broadband, Equity, Access and Deployment
  - Allocated \$826.5M for last mile fiber and alternative technologies
  - Gap is 131,000 locations
- Digital Equity Act Capacity Grant
  - Allocated \$12M Coming in 2025

## Advance-CPF Awards



- \$113 million awarded from Capital Projects Fund (CPF)
- 26 broadband projects
- Projects will connect more than 18,000 households in 24 counties
- All grant agreements are executed and projects are underway
- Projects must be completed by the of 2026



### Capital Projects Fund (CPF) Updates



- Earlier this year, we awarded \$113,500,000
- Additional funding awarded to the Southern Colorado Economic
   Development District in Crowley County to connect 1,753 homes and businesses in some of the most rural and underserved communities in Colorado
- Award details are on the <u>Advance-CPF website</u>
- First Coloradans connected to high-speed internet in Kiowa and Elizabeth

#### **Colorado's BEAD Applications Summary**

#### Funding Requested

- **\$1.78 billion** total BEAD funding requested
- + More than **\$500 million** in matching funds
- = \$2.3 billion in total for the proposed projects

#### Impact to Coloradans

- Total number of eligible locations applied for: 111,896
- No of unserved locations: 67,559
- No of underserved locations: 44,337

Every Colorado county has at least one application!

#### <u>Technology</u>

- Priority Broadband Project Application: 139
- Other Last-Mile Broadband Project Application: 46



### **BEAD Program Next Steps**



	Next Steps	BEAD Program Activities
1	Review Round 1 Applications	<ul> <li>Reach out to ISPs adjacent to Project Areas with no-bids and request that they serve those remaining areas</li> <li>Remediate high cost areas from current applications based on EHCPLT</li> </ul>
2	Update Project Area Maps	<ul> <li>Create a new Project Area Map that includes remaining Project Areas and EHCPLT locations</li> <li>Map will be available for ISPs to bid on</li> </ul>
3	Second Grant Round: Alternative Technology	• Open second grant round with Project Area Map for 30 days
4	Second Grant Evaluation	<ul> <li>Open to all applicants using the same scoring criteria</li> <li>Expecting to cover the remaining Project Areas</li> </ul>
5	Develop and Submit Final Proposal to NTIA	<ul> <li>Select and make preliminary awards for inclusion in the Final Proposal to the NTIA</li> <li>Initiate public comment process</li> </ul>



# ADANCE COLORADO BROADBAND

State & Local Dollars

### Advance State & Local Dollars Grant Program



#### HB24-1336 was enacted on May 22, 2024

- Repeals the Broadband Deployment Board
- Requires the CBO to establish a grant program criteria and guidelines for awarding HCSM funding:
  - A two tier grantmaking structure:
    - Tier One 60 percent of funding
      - Broadband Middle Mile Projects
    - Tier Two 40 percent of funding
      - Other unfunded broadband and telecommunication needs
  - Solicit input from the general public and various stakeholders
  - Create a work group
  - Establish a formal appeals process



- NEW grant program under the Advance Colorado Broadband Grant Program, called <u>State & Local Dollars</u>, or Advance-Local for short
- Award money from a state-funding program called the High-Cost Support Mechanism (HCSM) Fund to middle mile, last mile, short-term construction, and non-deployment projects
- Fill the gaps left by federal funding
- CBO published the <u>Program Guidelines</u> and <u>Appeal Policy</u> with a 30 day public comment period closed on Dec. 6

## Digital Equity Program Timeline

Colorado's Digital Access Plan approved by NTIA in April 2024

Application for Digital Equity Act Capacity funds submitted May 28

Colorado receives \$12 million in funding in by end of 2024

Implementation begins early 2025

Additional funding opportunities expected in 2025 & 2026


