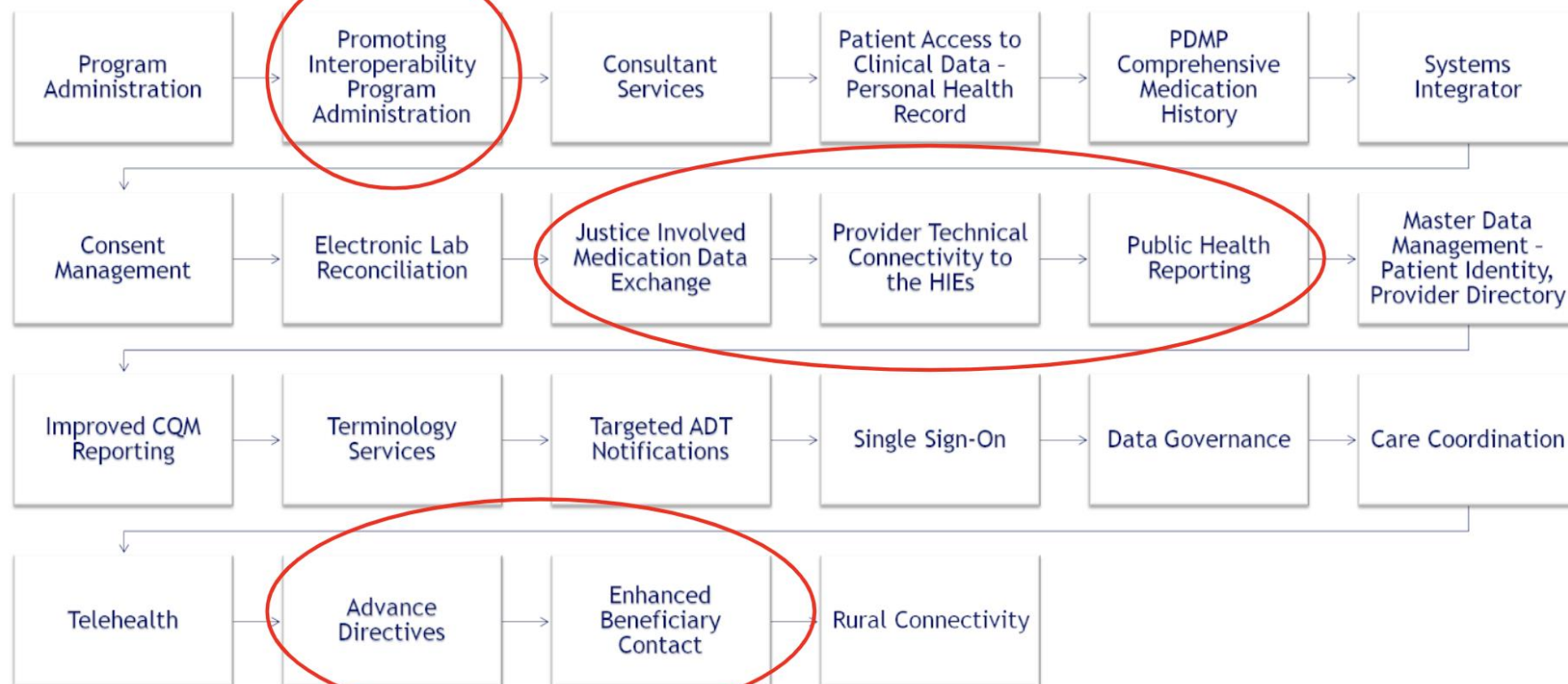

Current Project Funding

- Federal HITECH Dollars for projects:
 - Approved through an Implementation Advance Planning Document (IAPD) process
 - IAPD projects are based on Colorado's Health IT Roadmap and Promoting Interoperability
 - Projects/activities can be either for planning or design, development and implementation (DDI)
 - Does not pay for operations
 - Must support a provider's achievement of Meaningful Use
 - Legislatively expires September 30, 2021
- HCPF is the State Agency for administering IAPD funds (coordinated with OeHI)
- State Budgets - OeHI, HCPF, and other agency state appropriated budget that is used to “match” the HITECH funding or used to fund projects/modules directly
- *Modules can transition to Medicaid operations if the module is certified in the Medicaid Enterprise*

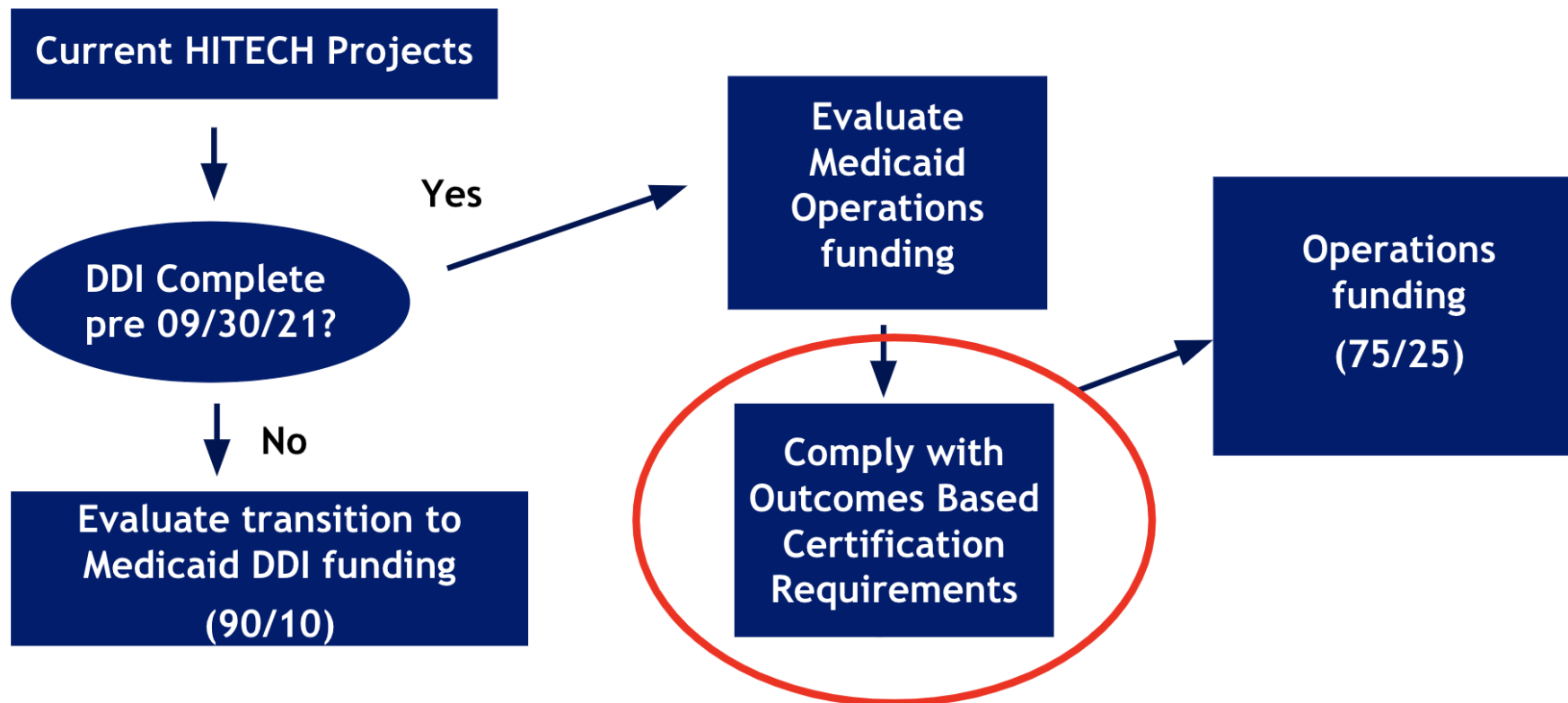

Considerations for Transition of Funding

- Has DDI been completed for the project?
- Does the project support Medicaid operations?
- Can the project satisfy outcomes-based certification?
 - Collection and reporting of metrics for 6 months?

Planning for Transition



Outcomes-Based Certification

- Federal Requirement for enhanced match for operations (Operations-IAPD)
- Goal: OBC ensures that Medicaid systems are focused on achieving outcomes to *improve Medicaid programs*
- If leveraging Federal MMIS Operations dollars then the module needs to be a part of the Medicaid Enterprise and must be certified
- Evaluates how well Medicaid information technology systems support desired business outcomes

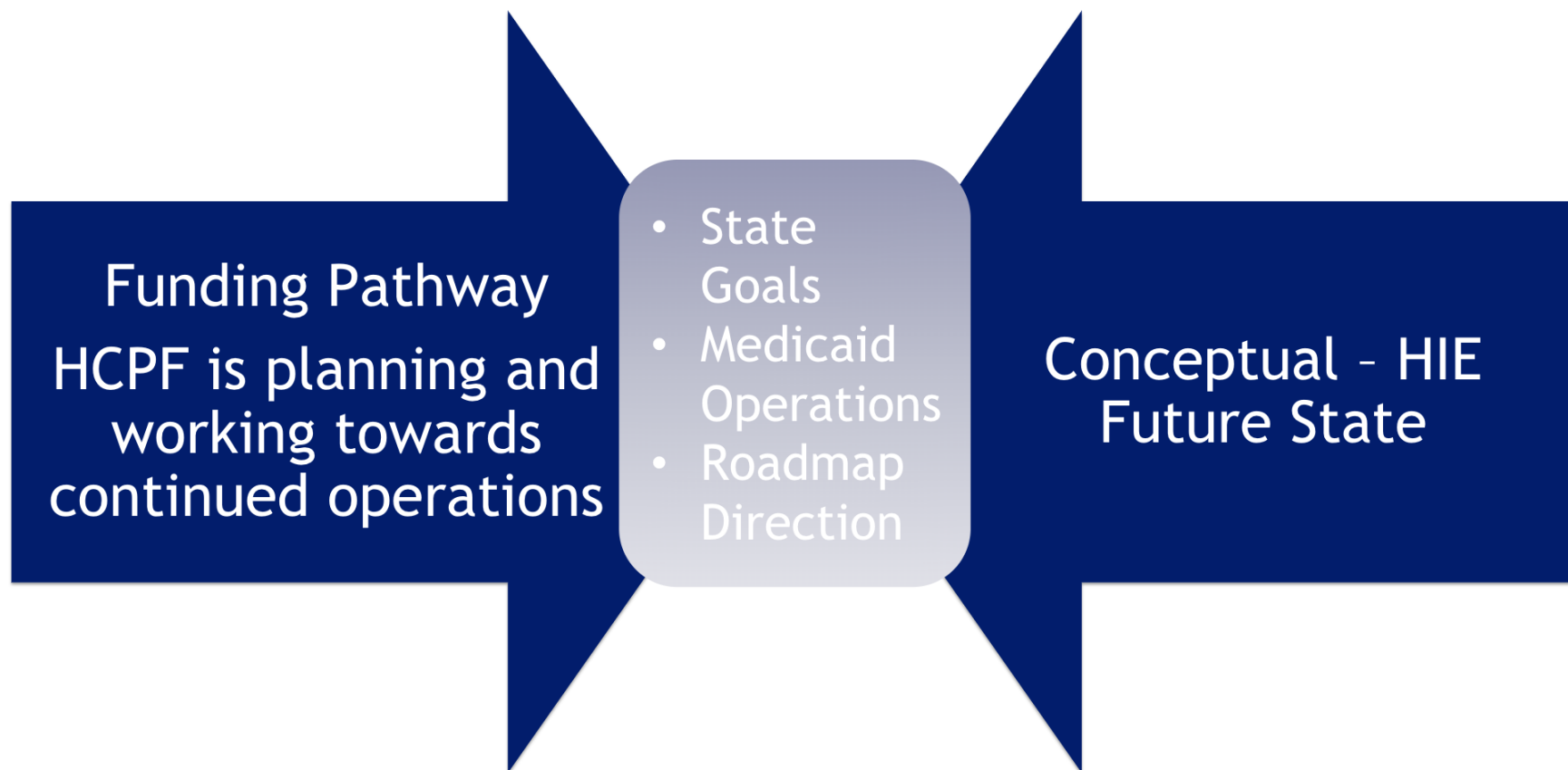

Proposed Outcome Metrics

Outcomes	KPIs
Improve Care Coordination across care team members to reduce avoidable hospital utilization	# of successful transition records (ADTs) to a patient's primary care physician (PCP) or other healthcare professional (care team members), # of times the Community Health Record is queried, # of direct messages by a Medicaid provider for a referral
Inform Medicaid's program administration on Medicaid population's health via reporting of hospital utilization and gaps in services	Timely and accurate reporting to Medicaid with Medicaid beneficiary hospital utilization patterns over a given time frame (criteria: hospital utilization, an indicator for readmissions, and key prevention quality indicators)
Reduce unnecessary tests and help State Medicaid Agencies increase quality care while driving down costs via utilization of Registries/Public Health Reporting	# of labs exchanging data through the HIE, # of hospitals sending data to CDPHE, % of lab reporting completed electronically, # of queries to registries

OBC Terms

- Outcomes - a discrete and measurable improvement to Medicaid program management, monitoring, or administration, resulting from the delivery of Information Technology (IT) system functionality
- Metrics - measures that would demonstrate whether a system is meeting an outcome
- Data - production information for the agreed-upon metrics that states provide to CMS to demonstrate whether a system is meeting the agreed-upon outcomes

Outcomes-Based Certification

- Outcomes-based certifications for Operational Projects (OBC) are being designed to:
 - Enable CMS to make data-driven funding (FFP and FMAP) decisions
 - Ensure states' solutions achieve the required business results
- The HIT capabilities must be certified to qualify for the 75/25 match
- CMS approval of decided outcomes and metrics
- Reporting and collection of metrics for six months

Outcomes-Based Certification

- Will need to certify and therefore have Outcome measures for:
 - HIE infrastructure (ADTs) that will be certified
 - HDCo solutions
- Future projects that will need to be certified:
 - PDMP / Prescription Monitoring Solution
 - Care Coordination Solution
 - Provider Directory Solution
 - Patient Matching Solution
 - Medicaid Blue Button API and services

2 Types of OBC Project Outcomes

CMS-Required

- Based on statute, regulation or other formal guidance and are module-specific
- No CMS required Project Outcomes for HIE (YAY!)
- Requirements for PDMP coming
- Possible for Public Health systems

State-specific

- Project Specific
- Based on Colorado's Medicaid Enterprise/ecosystem
