- Funding Priorities Approved by eHealth Commission in April 2020
- Project review focused on Data and Analytics investments
- Health Tech Solutions (HTS) conducted interviews with stakeholder and vendor partners
- Colorado Health Institute (CHI) reviewed data flows

PROJECT IDENTIFICATION AND IMPLEMENTATION:

- 70% strongly agreed and/or agreed that the right people were engaged at the right-time for decision making
- 50% agreed that the goals and needs were identified and clearly stated when identifying which projects could potentially be funded

PROJECT IMPACT:

- COVID-19 Lab Results delivered quicker to patients and providers when integrated into Health Information Exchanges (HIES)
- 84 New Providers added to the HIES
- Symptom Tracker/ COVID TECH effective collaboration
- Health IT Roadmap investments and contracts leveraged
- Mapping of Data Flows and Systems for Public Health Emergency Needs
- Safety-net providers accessing analytics for COVID response
- Building the foundation for rural connectivity

FUTURE CONSIDERATIONS:

- Refine Data Flows and Analytics Approaches and Redundancy
- API Based Connectivity
- Shared Solutions and Shared Architecture
- Impact of ONC/CMS Interoperability Rules
- Continued collaboration between OeHI, CDPHE, HCPF, CDHS, & OIT
