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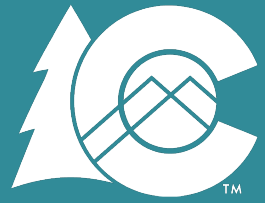
Rural Health IT Steering Committee

- **What are the goals/outputs?**
 - **Increase HIE connectivity amongst Rural hospitals and clinics**
 - **Funding Strategy for new approved funding**
 - **HIE connectivity**
 - **System upgrades for Rural Providers**
 - **Technical Assistance**

- **What has been accomplished?**
 - **Technical assistance - data vault connectivity, workflow and data mapping, quality improvement , HIE connectivity**
 - **Data Vault access - 68 (81%)**
 - **Data in the system - 30 (36%)**
 - **Workflow completed for 1 HTP measure - 22 (26%)**
 - **Connected to HIEs - Only 7 CAHs and RHCs remaining**

- Outreach!
 - What is the purpose of our outreach?
 - Connect rural providers to Colorado's Health Information Exchanges (HIEs) that have not yet connected
 - Meet with rural providers to adopt health information, data sharing, and analytics through implementation support
 - Identify any roadblocks
 - Identify what has been going well and what could be improved

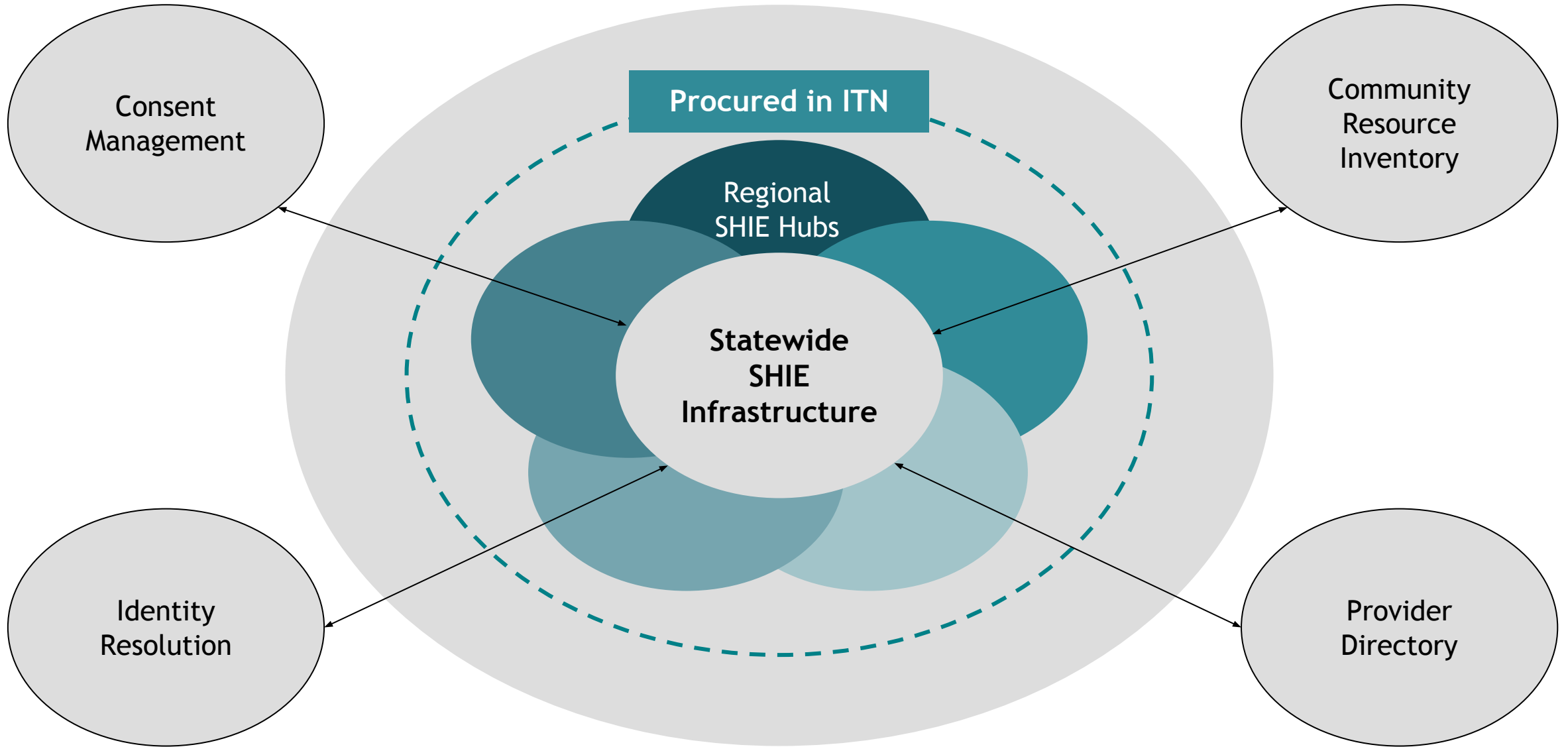
RFP vs. ITN 101

Request for Proposals (RFP)	Invitation to Negotiate (ITN)
Procurement for a specific solution with many technical requirements	Procurement to solve a particular problem with flexibility in how to implement
Mostly requirements, some expectations	Mostly expectations, some requirements
Front-loaded	Back-loaded
SOW/contract posted with the RFP	SOW/contract negotiated as a component of the ITN process



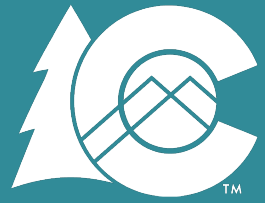
- **Current task: Internal HCPF review process**

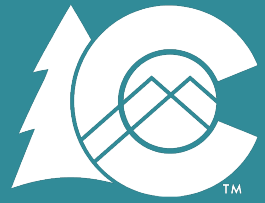
