Colorado’s Broadband Initiative and CTN Services

Kyle Brown, Health Policy Advisor, Governor’s Office

- The role of the Commission in providing input on Broadband
 - Best way to encourage messaging at the federal level is to work with the Governor’s Office and/or OIT (in the case of broadband) to provide a united front at the State level
 - Action item to discuss this as a Commission and provide talking points

Brian Shepherd, OIT - Broadband Program Manager

- Overview of State’s broadband efforts and partnership with CTN
- The goal of the state is to have universal broadband access, and the best/most realistic way to do so is to work through the following institutional elements:
 - Education
 - Healthcare
 - Public Safety
 - Economic Development
- 30-35% of Colorado’s rural households do not have broadband access, lower than average
- Statewide Broadband Strategy
 - Started with a grassroots approach, turned into a regional and local planning approach
 - Governor’s Broadband Metrics
 - Rural availability to 80% and statewide to 95% by June 2017
 - Ensure 100% of schools meet national connectivity guidelines by 2020
 - Complete all 12 rural regional strategic plans by June 2017

Ed Bostic, CTN - Executive Director

- Colorado Telehealth Network’s (CTN) mission is to maximize access to health care services.
- CTN offers two broadband subsidy programs.
- The first is **CTN1** which offers a **private secure, healthcare dedicated broadband network** infrastructure connecting hospitals, FQHCs, behavioral health centers, and other qualifying providers throughout Colorado. Eligible providers can receive 65% subsidy under this program.
- The second program is called **NetConnect (CTN2)**. While CTN1 only offers the service through CenturyLink, NetConnect is **vendor neutral** and allows for participants to save on average 49%

on broadband services. Eligible services and equipment under this program include any advanced telecommunications or information service that enables HCPs to post their own data, interact with stored data, generate new data, or communicate, by providing connectivity over private dedicated networks or the public Internet for the provision of health information technology

- Colorado Telehealth Working Group (CTWG)
 - o Coalition of stakeholders created to discuss ways to reduce the barriers to telehealth and accelerate adoption

Overview: Health IT and Data Exchange Standards

Kate Kiefert and Carol Robinson, CedarBridge Group

- Open System Interconnection (OSI) Model of Network Layers is a national data standard for Health IT data exchange
- Categories of Standards
 - o Vocabulary and code sets (semantics)
 - o Format, content, and structure
 - o Transport
 - o Security
 - o Services
- ONC Interoperability Standards Advisory (ISA) - coordinates identification, assessment, and determination of “recognized” interoperability standards
- Meaningful Use Certification - provides the best available standards in each of the data standards categories
- Standards Development Organizations (SDOs)
 - o Health Level Seven International (HL7) - provides interoperable standards to improve care delivery, reduce ambiguity, optimize workflow, and enhance knowledge transfer
 - FHIR (Fast Health Interoperable Resources) is the current HL7 standard - some implementations are currently underway
 - o IHE - translates and organizes the SDOs
- Quality Reporting Standards - intended to provide a way to compare reported data
